

What we are learning in Reception Term 3 Our theme this term is 'Once Upon a Time'

Phonics	We are starting phase 3 mastery lessons in Phonics – we will be focusing on reading independently and writing simple
	sentences which include common exception words. We will also be starting Guided Reading sessions in small groups too.
Maths	Each week will focus on a different unit of work. We currently use White Rose Maths to plan and teach our lessons. We will
	be covering numbers to 8 and mass and capacity. We can now count to 5 and identify 2D shapes.
Communication	This term we will be doing lots of storytelling and acting out our favourite stories. We will be singing nursery rhymes and
and Language	songs linked to traditional tales. We will be focusing on speaking in full sentences including 'because' to explain our ideas.
Personal, Social	Our Jigsaw piece is called 'Dreams and Goals' where we will be learning how to overcome challenges, show perseverance
and Emotional	and achieve special goals.

Physical	This term we will be developing our Ball Skills. We will be using different balls from a variety of sports – moving them in

Expressive Arts	Our 'Artist of the term' is Andy Goldsworthy. The children will be exploring the outdoors and creating art using natural
and Design	resources.
