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A Message from the Headteacher



Firstly, I would like to start with thanking everyone who was able to make it to our maths 'Work-a-longs' this week; the children have really enjoyed working with different adults, regardless of whether they were their own or not. We hope these sessions help you at home to also understand some of the maths curriculum that we teach.

It has certainly been an eventful and busy week at Waycroft, which included what can best be described as a waterfall suddenly appearing from the ceiling of the Year 6 Cutty Sark classroom! I am mentioning this because we were so proud of the way that the children in Cutty Sark class have adapted to having to move to a different place. The class have spent the rest of their week based in the Pioneer building after staff and children worked together to set up their classroom - thank you to everyone for working together as a team in a tricky situation!

If your child has a school dinner, you are probably aware that Mrs Sweet and I hand out dinner bands so the children are reminded of what lunch has been ordered. For all children who have a cooked dinner, please can parents/carers make sure that:

• The dinner is always booked online. Otherwise the kitchen have to give your child whatever they have cooked the most of, regardless of how much he/she likes it. This is nearly always a jacket potato.

- You share the menu with your child and discuss with them what they would like.
- Your child is reminded of what they have ordered each day, unless of course they have a jacket potato or pasta every day etc.

This is especially important for any children with special educational needs. Whilst we would love to be able to give children the option to change what is booked, we are not able to do so due to the kitchen cooking for the numbers booked. We also want to make sure that all children get the meal which you have booked for them.

Looking forward to term 4, we will be having a GB athlete visiting our school to complete some fitness circuits with the children and lead an assembly with them to promote being active, resilient and healthy. On Monday 10th February, I will be announcing in assembly who our visiting athlete will be and the children will be bringing home sponsorship forms. There is no pressure for anyone to raise money for the event, everyone from Y1-6 will take part; however, as a school we will receive a voucher that we can spend on equipment to promote physical activities if money has been raised. A letter will be sent about the event in the next week.

Safeguarding/Health and Safety

Penalty Notices

- If a child has at least 10 (10 or more) sessions of unauthorised absence in 10 school weeks, their parent/carer(s) may receive a penalty notice (a morning or afternoon is one session; a whole school day is two sessions.)
- The first time a penalty is issued within a three-year rolling period, it is £80 (per parent/carer, per child) payable within 21 days, rising to £160 if paid between 22 and 28 days. (If the fine is not paid, the parent/carer may be prosecuted for the child's unauthorised absence.
- The second time a penalty notice is issued to the same parent/carer for the same child the amount will be £160 per parent/carer, per child (if paid within 28 days). There is no reduction in the amount if the penalty is paid early. (Again, if the fine is not paid, the parent/carer may be prosecuted.)
- Fines per parent/carer will be capped to two fines within any 3-year period. Once this limit has been reached, a prosecution will be considered. Prosecution may result in fines of up to £2,500 per parent/carer, per child.

Reception

We have been practising 'down' letters in our jotters and the handwriting across Reception is really developing and our children are becoming more confident writers! We are so proud. 
















LKS2


























UKS2



Year 5

Year 5 have had great fun this week planning Britain's defence against German invasion in the battle of Britain. This involved the children using primary and secondary sources to decide on a strategy and then budgeting for it. In addition, each class has been learning about the wonders of space focusing on understanding key principles of our solar system and how it affects our planet. Our focus in indoor PE was static balance which involved children developing their balance while carrying out different tasks.

Year 6

The Y6 children have been working incredibly hard for the past few weeks. In maths, they have been exploring ratio and proportion. They seemed to have grasped these concepts well have learnt how to apply them to tackle everyday life problems—skills that will really serve them well beyond the classroom. In English, both classes have been really engaged with our latest writing unit, using their interest in the LA recent forest fires as inspiration for writing newspaper articles. We've also been linking our geography lessons to English. This week, all the children have been researching a recent natural disaster for their showcase writing. In science, the classes have been busy creating a timeline about the evolution of humans.

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
